


CHAPTER & INDIVIDUAL GRANTS

Hello Thetas,

As next year's chapter President, I wanted to say a few words about our ever-changing situation. You will be reading this after being quarantined in your home for days, possibly weeks. Thinking about NEXT YEAR is impossible when we don't know what the next day will bring. My job is to think about our chapter, and I am sure that we love helping our community while fostering our friendships. This national crisis has changed so many things, but not that. So, the board and I will work to plan next year's schedule just as before, hoping that we can all convene in September to share laughs, hugs (!) and lots of stories.

There are many new ideas in the works for next year already. Soon, you will receive your dues letter and the Interest and Involvement Sheet, which lists many more opportunities for you to get involved. I hope you will read it closely and check those things that interest you, as we want to have fun, but we also hope to utilize your talents and skills in new ways! Your dues letter will be arriving in May, but the deadline to pay will be extended to mid- June. **There will be NO increase in dues**. In fact, if you are a Theta Star member (\$100), we hope to dedicate the extra funds you pay (\$35) to offset the membership of Young Thetas and others who cannot afford to pay dues next year. "Paying it Forward" will allow Thetas to remain alumnae members during this difficult time.

We are also working diligently to adjust our budget. We depend on your dues (the chapter keeps \$34 of your \$65 payment, \$31 goes to the Fraternity) to operate, and we will still need to ask you to pay to attend individual events such as Founders Day. We will cut back where we can and be creative with our funds...the same way you budget at home. We hope you will consider your Theta membership important enough to sustain, for "a lifetime."

One of the changes we are making this year is to create a digital Directory. Most other organizations, and virtually all Theta alumnae chapters have stopped printing a directory, due to the high costs of printing and postage. We have been working on this for a while now, and we will make it "user friendly," so don't worry. I think you will see what a useful tool it is for us, and you'll feel SO SMART when using it. We will all be learning how to use it together, so please be patient and help us make this a smooth transition. In closing, I am going to share with you some words directly from Theta Headquarters:

This is definitely a time of uncertainty! But since our founding 150 years ago, Thetas have experienced good times, bad times, and in-between times. During all of these, our sisterhood has supported and uplifted us and helped us be resilient and strong. With patience, kindness, and perseverance, we will all come through this.
